Discussion Questions

Joshua 13-14

1. What does God point out to Joshua about Himself and about the land at the beginning of chapter 13?
2. After reading what God says in 13:6, what can we learn about God's role in helping us accomplish the mission He has called us to do?
3. Reading Joshua 14: 1-2 and Numbers 33:54-56 as background, what difficulties do you expect Joshua faced as he tried to divide the land fairly? What methods were used to divide the land?
4. Why does God call this land an "inheritance" for Israel (Genesis 17:7-8)?
5. Caleb's name means "whole hearted". After reading 14:6-15, do you think his name is appropriate? Why or why not? What other character traits does he demonstrate in this passage?
6. This passage describes Joshua and Caleb at a turning point in their lives. Joshua is nearing the end of his life. Caleb is also elderly; yet he is ready to launch a new adventure with the Lord. What does it say to us about living by faith in the midst of life's changing circumstances?
