Discussion Questions

Joshua 24

1. Verses 1-13 summarize the specifics of God's commitment to us and our response. To whom does Joshua speak (v. 1)? What is his audience's background (v. 2)? What does God do for them (vs. 3-6)?
2. What do vs 6-11 tell us about the other challenges Israel has faced and what God has done for them in the midst of their troubles (vs. 7-13)?
3. Based on God's actions on behalf of his people, what does Joshua tell the Israelites to do (vs. 14-15) and what is his commitment (v. 15)? How does Israel respond and why (vs. 16-18)?
4. According to vs. 19-20, what is Joshua's main concern at the end of his life? How does he model his values (v. 15) and how does he effectively rally the Israelites to follow God wholeheartedly (vs. 25-27)?
5. Based on vs. 28-33, describe the events that occur to conclude this phase of Israel's history. How did Israel act and why (v. 31)? What negative future events are foreshadowed? (See Judges 2:6-15).
6. Based on what we have learned from our study of Joshua's life, choose one of his character traits that you would like to imitate. Use this to describe the legacy you would like to leave to your family, co-workers, believing, and un-believing friends.
