

Women's Bible Study Discussion Questions

2 Timothy 3

1. Why does being burdened by sin and led astray by passions make us more vulnerable to false teaching?
2. Read verse 7 and then verses 14-17. There is a radical difference between the person who is "always learning and never able to arrive at a knowledge of the truth" and the person "made wise for salvation." How can we be sure that we are the latter and not the former?
3. Read Exodus 7:10-13. Jonnes and Jambres are traditionally believed to be the names of Pharaoh's magicians. Both in the time of the Exodus and in the time that Paul wrote this letter, magic of that kind in a story would have been looked on as a sign of power and greatly admired. What might an equivalent be today? What might a false teacher use as a sign of power today?
4. According to verses 14-16, what does Paul expect Timothy to base his faith upon? What do you base your faith upon?
5. How do you view scripture? How does that effect your faith and the way you live?
